Healing Tree Farm at DeYoung

Samantha and Christopher Graves of Healing Tree Farm are leasing 12 acres here at the DeYoung Farmstead. Operating under the *principles of permaculture*, the Graves examine and mimic the forest edge with their farming approach. By integrating growth patterns and biological processes they will build and maintain healthy soil, increase bio-diversity, and generate closed feedback loops. Edible forest gardening is a gentle approach to farming that utilizes biological controls in place of harmful biocides. The result is a landscape that looks and functions much like the surrounding native ecology, sustaining not only those who farm the land, but also the
