Pre-Picnic Field Trips

Explore, learn, get to know your Conservancy Staff and Docents!

3pm Whaleback Hike

Join staffers Fields Ratliff and Sarah Cook for a hike to learn about native plant communities and on-going restoration efforts such as the management of the invasive ground cover Sweet Woodruff. The hike will also include a stop at the Whaleback Platform with panoramic views of the Manitou and Fox Islands. The trail includes a steep section about 1,500 ft long so please bring the appropriate footwear. This is a family friendly event so feel free to bring the kids! Limit 20.

3pm Houdek Dunes Hike

Head out on a hike with staffer Jenee Rowe, to reach the highest spot here. You'll hike new terrain including, windy narrow trails through the shady northern hardwood forest, climb long dune ridges and be inspired by fresh vistas, mammoth birch trees and Houdek Creek. Learn how our Stewardship team unlocks the clues from nature to direct how we care for treasured Natural Areas like Houdek Dunes. This 2-mile trek includes moderate to steep slopes. Dress for the weather, wear sturdy shoes and a hiking stick. Meet at the Houdek Dunes parking area off M-22. Limit 25.

3pm Hike Clay Cliffs

This gorgeous property is sandwiched between Lake Leelanau and Lake Michigan, containing 105 acres of diverse habitat including spectacular clay bluffs overlooking Lake Michigan and mature hardwood forests that contain trees predating European The Conservancy has partsettlement. nered with Leland Township to acquire this property as a new Natural Area. Staffers Brian Price, Matt Heiman and Anne Shoup will talk about the major habitat types and unique features of the property. Expect to do some hill-climbing and hiking off trail. Meet at the Picnic site to carpool to the property. Limit 40.

3pm Farmland Bus Tour

Join staffer Tom Nelson and former Ag Research Station Director and Conservancy Board Member, Jim Nugent on a tour of protected farms. Along the way, you'll have a chance to ask questions and hear about our farmland protection program and how farmers and others are responding to the devastating 2012 fruit crop failure. Bus departs from picnic site. Limit 40.

3:30 pm Conservation Hike

Join Conservancy staffers Yarrow Wolfe and Rick Halbert on a unique botanical and restoration hike from the picnic site through one of our most extensive land protection corridors. We will explore the different natural habitats, and see amazing views as we pass through active orchards and farmland. We will meet Paul Fischer, owner of the Happy Hour, to learn about a restoration project taking place nearby. This hike is for the more adventurous. We will go off trail to explore the 'hidden' gems of these private properties. Wear long pants,boots/covered shoes, and bring insect repellent. Water will be provided. Limit 25.

3:30 pm Hike Clay Cliffs

See 3pm description, but note that the 3:30 hike will be shorter and less vigorous. Meet at the Picnic site to carpool to the property. Limit 20.

3:15 pm Naganaba Trail To Soper Preserve Hike

Beginning at Northport Village's Nagonaba Trail, join Docents Ann McInnis & Candy Gardner on a gentle hike through Village property to the Soper Natural Area. Along the way, you'll discover interesting things in the various natural communities. Streams, forested wetlands, woodlands, open areas, Braman Hill, are all guaranteed to add interesting tidbits to your nature knowledge. Family friendly. Meet at the West end of Nagonaba Road in Village of Northport.

4pm--VOLT Test Drives

Our "Green" Sponsor, Chevy VOLT, will be offering "ride and drive" experiences in their electric car. Sign up for a time slot; test drives will depart from the Picnic site. Four cars and staff from VOLT will be on hand.

6 pm & 7pm For Kids: Hike and Nature Scavenger Hunt

Sign your kids up to hunt for treasures in nature while you attend the picnic. These short hikes around the picnic site will leave from and return to the Kid's Tent. Remember those brown paper bag scavenger hunts from your childhood? Staffer Jenee Rowe still has one of those beloved vintage lists. Jenee, her two young boys, and docent Ann McInnis will lead your kids on a grand adventure. Dress for playing outside, layer on the sunscreen and bring a bug net, if you have one. Limit to 20 kids per time slot.
